During his youth he developed a great interest, and love, for the Orthodox faith, and devoted his life to it. In 1964 he became a tonsured monk serving at two San Diego Russian Orthodox churches. Louis/ Father Sergius spoke several languages fluently. He was especially gifted in Russian, and Russian Choral Music. He also had a passion for Chinese medicine, was an expert food critic in his own right. He loved to travel and spend time with his family. His greatest gift to all he encountered was his amazing smile and his great sense of humor. In



2009 he was awarded the title of "Great Schema" monk. In 2014 Father Sergius relocated to the St. Gregory of Palamas monastery in Etna, Ca. He will truly be missed by those he touched.
